Interpretive Hike Leaders – Dundas Valley and Albion Falls

The Giant's Rib Discovery Centre (GRDC) is located in the Dundas Valley Conservation Area. We are looking for individuals enthusiastic about the Niagara Escarpment World Biosphere Reserve, its preservation and interpretation to the public. Training will be provided. Minimum commitment of one hike per month required.

The hike program in the Dundas Valley was established in 2013 and will continue to run in 2015 (June to October). We are seeking hike leaders for our program at Albion Falls and the Dundas Valley.

One or two hikes (dependent on volunteer resources) will leave at predetermined times on weekends. Hike interpreters will be trained to deliver consistent information on guided hikes. Interpretive hikes will include information on cultural, natural, geological and other features of the Niagara Escarpment World Biosphere Reserve.

One hike every 4 would be required unless more frequency is desired. Hikes are for the general public and last between 1 and 2 hours each.

Volunteers receive free entry to the Dundas Valley Conservation Area and assistance with transportation may be available. Co-ordinator positions may also be asked to attend monthly Directors meetings, and are asked, if available, to volunteer a shift each month at the Centre, although it is not a requirement.
