The Giant's Rib Discovery Centre proudly announces the next presentation of the second annual Bruce Duncan Memorial Lecture Series.

This series, named in honour of the former General Manager of the Hamilton Conservation Authority, is dedicated to promoting the Niagara

Escarpment as an internationally-recognized World Biosphere Reserve, as well as being a truly unique topographic feature of our natural and cultural heritage.

Next Month: Sunday, March 8: Crooks Hollow: A Study of Change with John Aikman

This will be an illustrated presentation on one of Upper Canada's hidden jewels, that of Crooks Hollow which is located just north west of Dundas in the former West Flamborough Township.Settled in the early 1800's Crooks Hollow grew to become one of the largest personal entrepreneurial concentrations in Upper Canada. The talk will trace the early developments of the surrounding communities of Greensville, Bullocks Corners, Websters Falls, as well as the reasons for their demise in the mid 20th Century.

John Aikman was born and raised in Hamilton and has numerous degrees, including a B.A. (McMaster), B.Ed. (University of Toronto), M. Sc. Ed. (Northern Illinois University), and an M. Ed. (Brock University). He retired in 1996 from the hamilton Board of Education, where he worked for 35 years, primarily with the Outdoor Education Department.

Presently, he is Manager / Curator of the Educational Archives and Heritage Centre of the Hamilton- Wentworth District School Board.

He is also Vice Chairman, Advisory Council of the Westfield Heritage Village of the Hamilton Conservation Authority, Lead blacksmith at the Westfield Heritage Village, Deputy Council Commissioner, Battlefield Council of Scouts Canada. Formerly Vice Chairman of the Historical Board for the former Region of Hamilton-Wentworth, he is also and Author of the Crooks Hollow Walking Trail Brochure, published by the Hamilton Conservation Authority.

Waterfalls along the Niagara Escarpment by Joseph Hollick

Tew's Falls is located in the Greensville section of Hamilton on Harvest Road about 800 metres east of Brock Rd. The site is owned by the Hamilton Conservation Authority and a convenient parking lot is located there with a nominal fee being charged. From this parking lot, trails lead to Tew's Falls as well as to the Dundas Peak and Webster's Falls.

Tew's Falls is an overhang ribbon waterfall with year round flow. There are two viewing platforms located on the site allowing for safe viewing. Tew's Falls is the highest waterfall in Hamilton at 41 metres and is a spectacular waterfall to view in all four seasons.

The photo below shows Tew's Falls in winter (taken in Feb. 2009) with an ice cone or volcano growing from the bottom and extending about 2/3rd the way up.
