The President's Report

President Ken Hall's remarks regarding directions for the GRDC in 2011:

"It is my desire that the GRDC will continue with the established programs of:

- Distributing information and materials to the general public at the Trail Centre;
- Permitting artists and photographers to show their work at the Trail Centre;
- Offering the Bruce Duncan Memorial Lecture Series at the former Parks Canada Discovery Centre;
- Distributing Rocks and Mineral Curriculum Manuals to Grade 4 teachers;
- Reaching out to the public through our newsletter and web-site;
- Hosting an annual fundraiser event.

"The new directions that I would like the GRDC to pursue are:

- To investigate thoroughly the possibilities of opening a second site for the GRDC;
- To bring the Niagara Escarpment Recognition Program to the stage where the first awards would be given in 2011;
- To establish a partnership with the Hamilton Naturalist Club where we could become involved in their Head-of-the-Lake Land Trust Program particularly where it relates to the Niagara Escarpment;
- To begin a series of field trips related to the Niagara Escarpment for our Friends of the Giant's Rib;
- To investigate the possibility of beginning an annual Waterfalls of Hamilton Festival.

"I believe that we can reach these goals by utilizing the talents of the strong Board what we have and by seeking additional members who can assist us in providing leadership in these new directions".


For the Month of January 2011:



Waterfalls along the Niagara Escarpment

Kilbride Falls is located at the southern end of the community of Kilbride in the City of Burlington on the east side of Cedar Springs Road.

Kilbride Falls is considered a classic cascade type falls. Its height is approximately 3m (10 ft.) and its width varies from 2m (7 ft.) to 3m (10 ft.). Kilbride Falls is located on a branch of the Bronte Creek and has year round flow.



When the leaves are off the trees this waterfall is visible from Cedar Spring Road as you drive northbound into Kilbride. To get a closer view you can park on the shoulder where it widens out on the slight hill into Kilbride, then climb down the embankment to the creek and follow it upstream to the falls. There is no trail (yet) to this falls, thus be careful climbing down and following the creek to the falls. Also be careful on the roadway as there are some curves on the roadway and vehicles may not be expecting you.
